Connecting the little 'me' to make a big difference is your challenge.

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What can you do now to make a difference? How will your community benefit from the actions you plan and take?

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Here are a few ideas to get you started:



Are there enough green spaces within your community where people can spend time outdoors or where native plants and animals can thrive?





Are there local community projects that you could support with litter reduction, improved recycling/ upcycling or planting to encourage more insects to pollinate, growing food?



Is there an issue with excessive traffic that you feel is adding to pollution? Could you persuade people to walk or ride bikes to reduce this?

Research and think of an idea or project that will make a 'big' difference to your local community. You can research the 17 Global Goals agreed by world leaders at <u>https:// www.globalgoals.org/</u> Plan what actions and steps you will need to take to make a change.

Write a newspaper article or a letter to your local MP (in no more than 500 words) outlining your project, what issue it will address and what change it will make. You will need to be persuasive with your arguments and describing what support you may need in terms of resources or money.

Email your work to your school by midday on Friday 31 March. Your school will choose the best two pieces of work and will enter them into a Star Academies national competition.
