End of Year Letter

I would like to thank you again for your support through an ever-changing year. Staff and students have worked very hard throughout the year to ensure that students achieve the very best outcomes. Learners have seized opportunities to achieve their aspirational targets and enhance their leadership skills. The remarkable contribution of our parent community has, as always, been essential to our ongoing development and the successes that we have enjoyed. To continue doing this during these very testing times is testament to your dedication and support offered as parents. Thank you for this level of commitment to ensure your daughter's future success.

As well as a time of rest and relaxation, the summer holidays will provide our students with an important opportunity for reflection. In our Ofsted inspection in May 2018 inspectors described the conduct of pupils as 'impeccable' and their behaviour as 'exemplary.' Our school attendance is of a similarly high standard, and it is vitally important that we maintain these excellent levels of behaviour and attendance in September. I would be most grateful if you could continue to reinforce with your daughter the importance of respecting our school rules and values in relation to their conduct, attitude to learning and attendance.

I would also like to take this opportunity to provide you with important information for the new academic year to ensure that all parents and pupils are well prepared for the start of term.

Please take the time to read the important information below and make a note in your family diary planner of key dates.

School Opening for the new Academic Year

- **Year 7, 8, 9, 10 & 11 Pupils will be Monday 4th September 2023**

I will be writing to you in August with details on how your daughter will return to school.

Travelling to and from school

Please do ensure your daughter walks to and from school or takes public transport. If this is not possible, and you drive your daughter to school, do not drop off or pick up on the school road. This causes a danger to your daughter, other pupils, and the public as well as congestion and pollution.

Park your vehicle in a safe place, adhering to road regulations. We have a large retail park nearby for safe drop off and pick up if required or you can park on a road two or three blocks away from the school. Thereby reducing congestion and a danger to your daughter, other pupils, and members of the public.

Only use the '**Disabled Bays**' if you have a disabled badge related to your or your child's needs.

Only cross Bath Road using the **designated zebra or pelican crossings** to ensure your safety and your daughter's.

Your co-operation is much appreciated for the safety of your daughter, other pupils, and members of the public.

Please find enclosed the full-term dates for the new academic year.

It is very important that students attend school fully. Last year many students achieved attendance of 99% or higher - missing no more than 1 day from school during the year. Each year students with the worst attendance make less progress and achieve lower grades in their studies. Therefore, we will insist that students attend school fully and we will visit homes of students with poor attendance alongside the support from the Education Welfare Officer from the Local Authority.

As you know, **the school is not allowed to authorise any trips abroad during term time unless there are exceptional (emergency) circumstances for the student concerned.** Thank you for your support with this.

School Uniform

The uniform and appearance of our students reflects our ethos and commitment to the highest standards. Whenever the school uniform is worn, it must be complete and not mixed with non-uniform clothing. Parents should contact our School Uniform retailer (please see details below) in good time over the summer to ensure all items are purchased in time for the start of term. Thank you to parents who attended our Stevensons Uniform pop-up uniform shop on 4th July. Parent Pay & School Lunches

The price per day of a set meal is £2.50 as well as individually priced items to purchase. Parents will need to login in and top-up or register to use our cashless payment system ParentPay. If parents experience any problems setting up or managing their account, members of our school office team will be happy to help during the summer holidays and first week of term. We are unfortunately unable to accept any cash payments for school meals. Do ensure your ParentPay account at www.parentpay.co.uk is sufficiently funded and ready for use on the first day in school, alternatively you will have prepared a healthy pack lunch.

Free School Meals and Pupil Premium Guarantee

A student may be entitled to 'free school meals' if their parent or guardian receives low-income benefits. This year the school will make a '**Pupil Premium Guarantee**'. Any student who has registered successfully for 'free school meals' will receive:

- Free textbooks and stationery sold at the school
- Subsidised trips and outdoor educational visits upon request made by letter to the Principal



- Students will also have a guaranteed place on any after-school intervention class or enrichment club that they wish to attend

You will be able to claim free school meals for your child if you receive one of the following benefits:

- Universal Credit (provided you have an annual net earned income of no more than £7400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
- Income Support
- Income based Jobseeker's Allowance
- Income related Employment and Support Allowance
- Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on - paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit

To check your eligibility, you will need to access Slough Borough Council's online form (link below) or speak to the school office for assistance.

Safety on the Internet

Each year, a small number of our students use the internet at home in an unsafe or harmful way. As a result, it is possible for students to:

- Access pornography or graphic violence
- Engage in harmful conversations with adults pretending to be a teenager
- Send and receive inappropriate images and videos
- Be very tired in school after being on the internet for long periods during the night

Often, this is because parents:

- Have bought their daughter a mobile phone, iPad, or laptop before they were responsible enough to understand the risks
- Have not taken steps to ensure that the internet is safe and adequate filters are in place
- Have allowed their daughter to use her device unsupervised, often throughout the night
- Have not understood that an iPad or a laptop can be used in the same way at home as a mobile phone (to make calls, access websites and exchange images and videos)
- Have allowed their daughter to use social networking sites (such as Facebook, Instagram, TikTok and Snapchat) even though they are below the minimum age for these platforms

This is neglectful and puts your daughter and others at risk of great and lasting harm.

It is the responsibility of parents to ensure that they are aware of how their daughter uses the internet (and social networking) at home and that she uses it in a safe manner. Please:

- Discuss the importance of safer internet use with your daughter
- Take steps to make your daughter is safer on the internet, by:
 - ✚ Setting filters to block harmful content



- ✚ Making sure that your daughter does not have any devices in her bedroom overnight
- ✚ Only allowing your daughter to use the internet whilst under supervision
- ✚ Going through the rules about when and how your daughter may use the internet
- ✚ Thinking carefully whether your daughter is mature enough to have a device of her own
- ✚ Checking if your daughter is using social networking sites for which she is not yet old enough
- ✚ Contacting the school if you need advice and support in making the internet at home safer

Expectations of Conduct & Attendance

Establishing and maintaining the highest standards of conduct and attendance is vital to the success of every pupil and integral to our vision and values as a school. In our Ofsted inspection in May 2018 inspectors described the conduct of pupils as 'impeccable' and their behaviour as 'exemplary.'

I would be most grateful if you could reinforce with your daughter the importance of respecting our school rules and values in relation to her conduct, attitude to learning, attendance and punctuality as outlined in the Parent Handbook. We require parents support in ensuring pupils arrive to school on time and arranging any medical appointments and holidays outside of term time and school hours.

I would like to thank you for the faith you have shown in the school and the support that you have demonstrated during this academic year. Please do support your daughter to complete summer work given to your daughter to ensure a strong start to your daughter's learning in September and assessments that will take place by half term. I will be writing to you in the summer to share further details for a successful September start.

Over the course of the last four years, it has been a blessing to serve our children and a privilege to serve our wonderful community, hard-working parents, and selfless staff. At times, the task has been challenging but I have felt in awe of the support and teamwork demonstrated by parents, pupils and all my staff. I will have made mistakes, or our school has caused upset or worry to you or your daughter. I ask forgiveness for any shortcomings and thank you for your persistence and understanding.
